3. Two Results

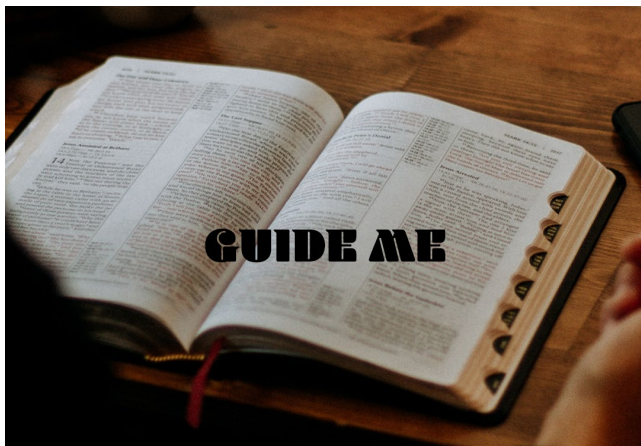
v15 “The Prayer of faith will save the sick and the Lord will raise him up”
